



Recycling in and around Farlington Parish

As stewards of God's creation, we are called upon to reduce, reuse and recycle our waste. Some items can't be put in your council recycling bin, so here are some suggestions for recycling some of those waste items.

Sainsbury's, Farlington, has collection points for batteries, water filters and plastic wrappings.

Drayton Information Centre, Havant Road, next to the Drayton United church, collects used printer cartridges, silver foil (must be clean), bottle tops, foreign coins, mobile phones and stamps. There are also collecting jars for used stamps at the back of each church. These go to the Leprosy Society.

Salvation Army clothing banks take textiles, shoes and trainers – located in various car parks around the parish including Drayton Park and Co-op, Salisbury Road.

Solent Infant school for all of the following items*

Any kind of pen and empty Tippex bottles



Used biscuit/cake wrappers (sweet or savoury). All brands of crisp wrappers, popcorn packets and Pringles tubes and lids.



Confectionary: chocolate and sweet packs and wrappers.

Plastic chocolate and sweets pouches and bags



Individual chocolate bar wrappers

Trigger heads, tops from washing up liquid bottles, home cleaning bottles and fabric conditioners.

Personal care and beauty products: facial wipes packing, caps, flexible plastics and roll-on deodorant, shampoo and body wash bottle tops (not the bottles, which can of course go into your council green bin) .



All brands of toothpaste tubes and caps, toothbrush outer packaging, toothbrushes and electric toothbrush heads

Court Lane Infant school for the following items*

Plastic milk bottle tops (green, red and blue) and crisp packets

Dobbies Garden Centre, Bartons Road, Havant has a recycling point for Plastic plant pots and trays.



British Heart Foundation collecting banks will recycle your books, CDs and DVDs – in various locations in the parish, including the Iceland car park in Cosham.



Unwanted tools and certain makes of sewing machines are also collected at the Drayton Information Centre for refurbishment by the charity which then sends them to Africa and elsewhere.
